



## **Admission Agreement**

This Admission Agreement ("Agreement") dated February 10, 2022, is between QUINSIGAMOND COMMUNITY COLLEGE, an educational corporation formed under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts with its principal office located at 670 W Boylston St, Worcester, Massachusetts, 01606 (hereafter referred to as "Quinsigamond Community College" or "QCC"), and NORTHEASTERN UNIVERSITY, a non-profit institution organized under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts with its principal office at 360 Huntington Avenue, Boston. MA 02115 (hereafter referred to as "Northeastern").

It is agreed by and between Quinsigamond Community College and Northeastern, for the mutual consideration and covenants herein contained, as follows:

- Quinsigamond Community College and Northeastern hereby agree to an admissions
  arrangement as set forth in this Agreement, whereby QCC graduates may be eligible to
  complete a Bachelor's degree at Northeastern's College of Professional Studies (CPS).
  Academic programs included in this agreement are identified below. This arrangement is
  referred to as the Community College Pathway ("Transfer Pathway").
- 2. The aligned academic programs included in this agreement include
  - a. Computer Information Systems-Enterprise to Information Technology
  - b. Computer Information Systems-Health Information to Information Technology
  - c. Computer Information Systems-Transfer to Information Technology
  - d. Electronics Engineering Technology-Mechatronics to Mechatronics
  - e. Manufacturing Technology to Advanced Manufacturing
- 3. Terms and conditions of the Transfer Pathway are set forth in detail in <u>Appendix A</u> of this Agreement ("Transfer Pathway Terms"). The Transfer Pathway Terms, as updated and amended from time to time, are incorporated in this Agreement by reference. All courses must be completed in accordance with each institution's academic standards and requirements, as published in the respective current catalog of each institution and set forth in any other applicable materials published by each institution, including the Transfer Pathway Terms.
- 4. To be eligible for the Transfer Pathway, students must (a) successfully complete an Associate degree program at Quinsigamond Community College; and (b) fulfill the prerequisites for the chosen program and be duly admitted through a transfer admissions

process as set forth herein and in the Transfer Pathway Terms. Northeastern retains full discretion to make the final decision on each student's application, and admission is not guaranteed. Northeastern reserves the right to rescind an offer of acceptance if the student is no longer considered in good academic or disciplinary standing between the time of acceptance and matriculation.

- 5. Quinsigamond Community College graduates accepted into Northeastern may transfer up to 64 semester-hours of credit from an accredited two-year college and are subject to the graduation requirements of the Northeastern catalog and other published standards issued by Northeastern in the year of matriculation. In addition, QCC graduates are subject to changes that may be required to meet accreditation standards, including, but not limited to, those established by the New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE) or those determined by Northeastern faculty as warranted to ensure a quality educational program.
- 6. Both institutions agree that they will communicate at the beginning of each fall term to discuss recruiting, entrance requirements, and any other concerns that either may have about the affiliation. Other communications between them may be scheduled as needs arise. Each party agrees that it will notify the other party as soon as possible of any changes to its programs that will impact this Agreement. Each institution shall provide the other with advance copies of, and an opportunity to correct or revise, any written materials that it intends to publish to describe the terms of this Agreement.
- 7. Both Northeastern and Quinsigamond Community College agree to make information available about the Transfer Pathway available to prospective students on the admissions pages of their website. Either party may advertise the arrangement described in this Agreement to its students, prospective students, and alumni through print, online, and interactive marketing materials such as fliers, websites, and other advertisements, subject to the guidelines and restrictions further described in this Agreement.
  - a. Each party shall provide the other with a high-resolution logo file and hereby grants the other license to use the name and/or logo as set forth above.
  - b. Use of the Northeastern name shall be "Northeastern University" in all communications. Shortened versions such as "Northeastern," "NU" or "CPS" shall not be used.
  - c. Use of the Quinsigamond Community College name shall be "Quinsigamond Community College" in all communications.
- 8. Neither institution shall use the name, logo, likeness, trademark, image *or* other intellectual property of the other for advertising, marketing, endorsement or any other purpose without the specific prior written consent of an authorized representative of the other Institution with respect to each such use.

- Quinsigamond Community College students admitted under this agreement will be automatically granted the community college Transfer Pathway discount. Information on the scholarship will be made available to prospective students on the Northeastern website. Northeastern will share information on this scholarship with Quinsigamond Community College by June 30 of every year.
- 10. This Agreement shall continue for three years from the date of final signature unless terminated earlier by either party as provided herein. Either institution may terminate this Agreement in any year, without cause, provided that the terminating institution has given the other institution written notice at least 90 days prior to the effective date of such termination and further provided that no such termination shall adversely affect any student then attending or accepted by Northeastern pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.
- 11. The Agreement shall be interpreted under and governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, without regard to its conflict of laws principles.
- 12. The parties agree that this Agreement embodies all of the agreements made by and between them, and supersedes any prior agreements and understandings, with regard to the acceptance of QCC graduates into Northeastern. Any modifications or amendments to this Agreement must be in writing and executed by both parties in order to be effective.

## Appendix A

Terms and Conditions of the Transfer Pathway:

To be admitted to a Northeastern Bachelor's Completion Program, a student must submit:

- A completed online transfer application: <u>northeastem.edu/cps-apply now</u>
- Official college transcripts demonstrating completion of an AA/AS degree, or
   o Official college transcripts showing that the student is registered and
   enrolled in their last academic term pending completion of their degree
- Transcripts reflecting a minimum cumulative GPA of at least 2.0.
- Official English Language Proficiency scores for students whose primary language is not English. These are required ONLY if student has not completed an AA/AS degree or two years of study (60 credits) at a U.S. institution.
