Charles Luster

My name is Charles Luster. I am originally from Flint, Michigan and moved to Worcester in 1989. I have had several jobs: retired Verizon employee, former assistant basketball coach at Becker College and former head coach of Quinsigamond Community College men's basketball. I have been an entrepreneur in the city for several years owning Allure Hair Design and Crescent Café. I am also responsible for the renaming of Martin Luther King Junior Boulevard and as of recent, the founder and executive Director of 2gether We Eat, a youth and intergenerational hydroponic farming program in Worcester County. I am the founder of The UnCommonwealth Group, where we just had our first black music festival in Worcester on June 24, 2022

Please tell us about your current career and what you love most about what you do?

I am the executive Director of 2gether We Eat, but what I love the most about my job is teaching people an alternative way of growing food from daycare centers to senior centers.
