

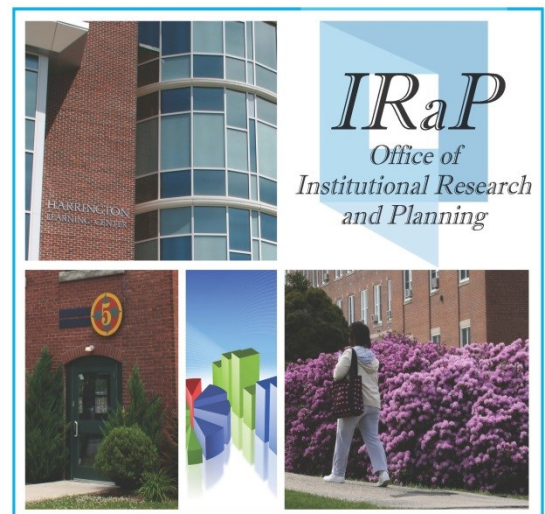

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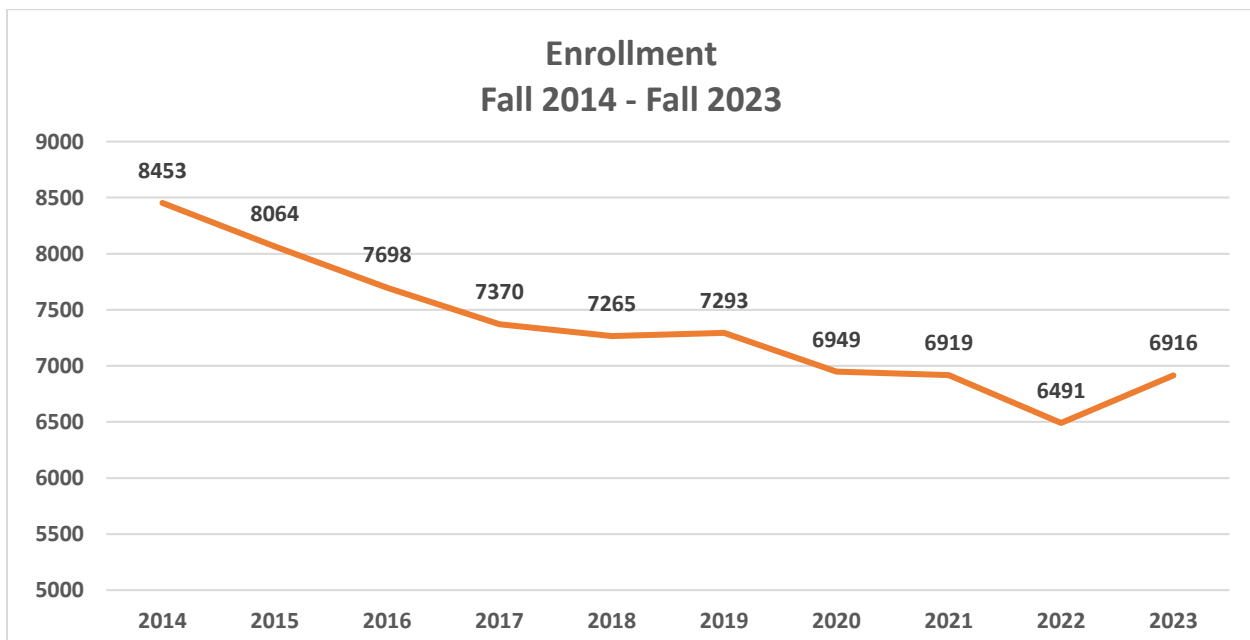
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## Overview

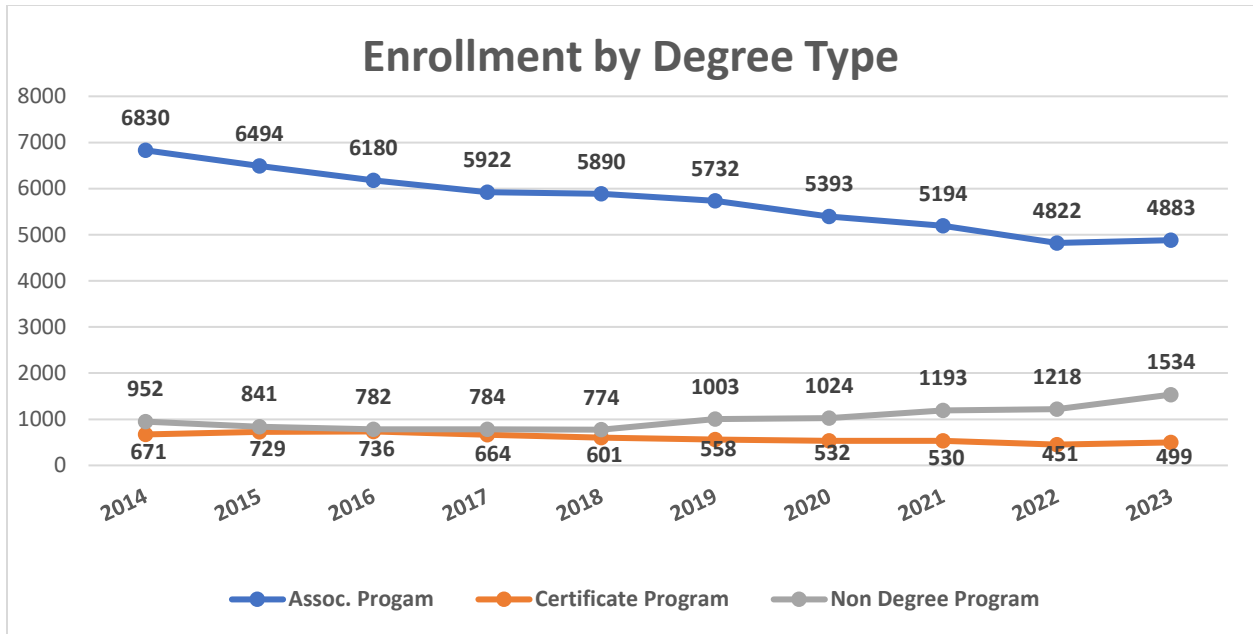
The Office of Institutional Research and Planning (IRaP) supports data driven decision making, institutional effectiveness, and student success. QCC's factbook is a compilation of current data including enrollment and demographic statistics, student success outcomes, demographics, and a variety of commonly requested information primarily used for reporting purposes. The factbook is updated once each year, and the data provided were the most current available at the time of the update. Narrative provides context for select charts and graphs.

### QCC ENROLLMENT



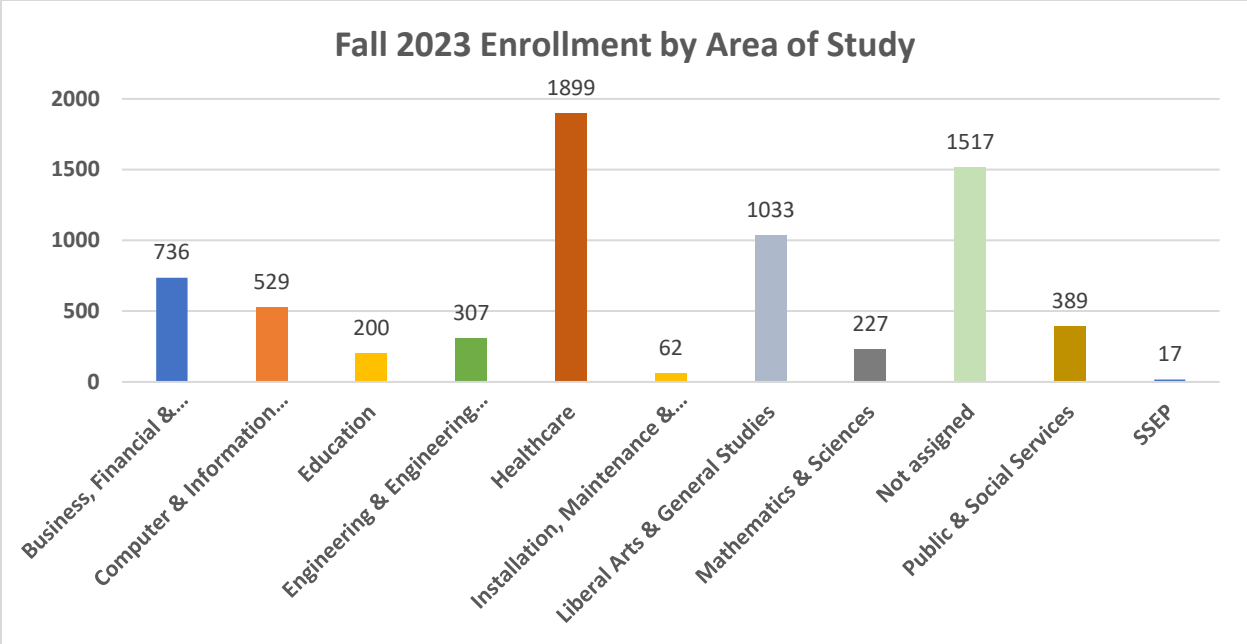

Community college enrollment in Massachusetts was at record highs after the 2008 great recession. Historically, when the economy is weak, college enrollment increases and decreases as the economy strengthens. As the economy has improved since 2008, enrollment at QCC has declined, although less than for Massachusetts community college enrollment. At QCC, enrollment is down 18% from fall 2014 to fall 2023 as compared to 30% for the entire Massachusetts state community college enrollment.

Just like general enrollment, QCC’s enrollment by degree type has been steadily declining. The number of associates and certificate program students decreased by 29% and 26% respectively, while the non-degree program student enrollment increased by 61% between fall 2014 and fall 2023. The increase in non-degree program enrollment can be largely explained by increases in the college’s dual enrollment program (high school students taking college courses). Growth in dual enrollment is a national trend that is driven by a combination of financial incentives, academic advantages, increased accessibility to college courses, and a desire to better prepare students for the demands of higher education and the workforce.

Even with the gradual decline in enrollment numbers, the School of Healthcare, through its General Studies in Healthcare, Pre-Nursing and Nursing Education programs, continues to have the highest student enrollment. It is followed by students with an unassigned area of study, comprising mostly of dual enrollment, consortium, twelfth year, and high school students enrolled in gateway courses. Liberal Arts and General Studies have the third highest enrollment.

Most students enrolled at QCC are at the degree seeking level. In fall 2023, degree seeking enrollment was 5,2382(78%), while non-degree enrollment was 1,534(22%). While degree seeking enrollment has steadily declined over the years (17% drop between fall 2018 and fall 2023), non-degree seeking enrollment on the other hand witnessed a 98% increase between fall 2018 and fall 2023, which can be largely attributed to increases in dual enrollment. In fall, 2018 309 (40% of non-degree students) students were dual enrolled as compared to 1,111 (72% of non-degree students) in fall, 2023.

Per the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), full-time students are more common across every institution type except for public two-year colleges, where part-time enrollment is the norm. In fall 2021, 35% of the 4.7 million undergraduate students at 2-year institutions were enrolled full time. In comparison, 73% of the 10.8 million undergraduate students at 4-year institutions were enrolled full time.

In fall 2023, QCC's part-time enrollment was 4,971, constituting 72% of the total student enrollment, while full-time enrollment constituted the remaining 28%. Between Fall 2019 and

Fall 2023, QCC witnessed a 21% decrease in full-time enrollment compared to a 3% increase for part-time students. The decline in full-time student enrollment is being mitigated by the large increase in part-time student enrollment noted earlier, in dual enrollment. Dual enrolled students are part-time.

The table above provides a comparative analysis of unduplicated student headcount information categorized by instructional methods for Fall 2022 and Fall 2023. The headcounts are unduplicated within each instructional method category, ensuring that each student is counted only once per category. The instructional methods include Lecture (LL LC), Online (OL), Blended In-Person (BL), Remote (RL BR), and Other Instructional Methods (IMs).

The data shows an increase in total student enrollment from 6461 in Fall 2022 to 6906 in Fall 2023. Notably, there was an increase in the percentage of students enrolled in Lecture, while Online and Remote methods saw a decrease in enrollment percentages. Blended In-Person saw a slight increase in enrollment. The unduplicated headcounts within each category ensure accurate representation of student participation in each instructional method.

With the overall decline in college enrollment rates, there was a small measurable difference between college enrollment rates in fall 2022 and fall 2023 for most racial/ethnic groups. Female students make up a larger proportion of QCC's students than male students. While there has been a steady decline in the percentage of male enrollment (42% in fall 2018 to 39% in fall 2023), female enrollment has been increasing through the years (58% in fall 2018 to 62% in fall 2023). There was a slight drop (1%) in female enrollment from fall 2022 to fall 2023 (63% to 62% respectively). The sharpest increase in female enrollment and the sharpest drop in male enrollment occurred during the pandemic, reflecting the large impact of remote school and work on QCC's enrollment patterns.

Like many other colleges, QCC struggles to hire faculty and staff members that are racially and ethnically representative of the student body. The proportion of faculty and staff members from various racial and ethnic groups has remained relatively constant from Fall 2018 to Fall 2023. During fall, 2023, the highest proportion of faculty and staff members identified as white (82% and 80%, respectively). Among faculty and staff members, Hispanics are the second largest group after whites, followed by Asian (6% and 5%, respectively), and Black (4% and 5% respectively). While only 6% of faculty members identified as Hispanic, 8% of staff identified as Hispanic. The student population, in comparison, identifies as 43% white, 24% Hispanic, 16% black, and 6% Asian (fall 2023)

To determine our retention rate, we start with the number of first-time students enrolled at QCC during a given fall semester (fall to fall), which is the unduplicated headcount. We then subtract the number of students who withdrew from the college during that 12-month period to get the number of retained students. The number of students who have graduated within the academic year is also subtracted. The number of retained students divided by the number of all enrolled students is the retention rate.

Two-year institutions generally focus on providing student instruction and related activities through a range of career-oriented programs at the certificate and associate degree levels and preparing students to transfer to 4-year institutions. Among first-time, full-time undergraduate students who began seeking a certificate or associate degree at QCC (2-year degree-granting institutions) in fall 2019 (cohort), 11% attained their credentials within 100%, while 28% attained their credentials within 200% of the normal time required for completion of these programs (2023 graduating year). An example of completing a credential within 200 percent of the normal time is completing a 2-year degree within 4 years.

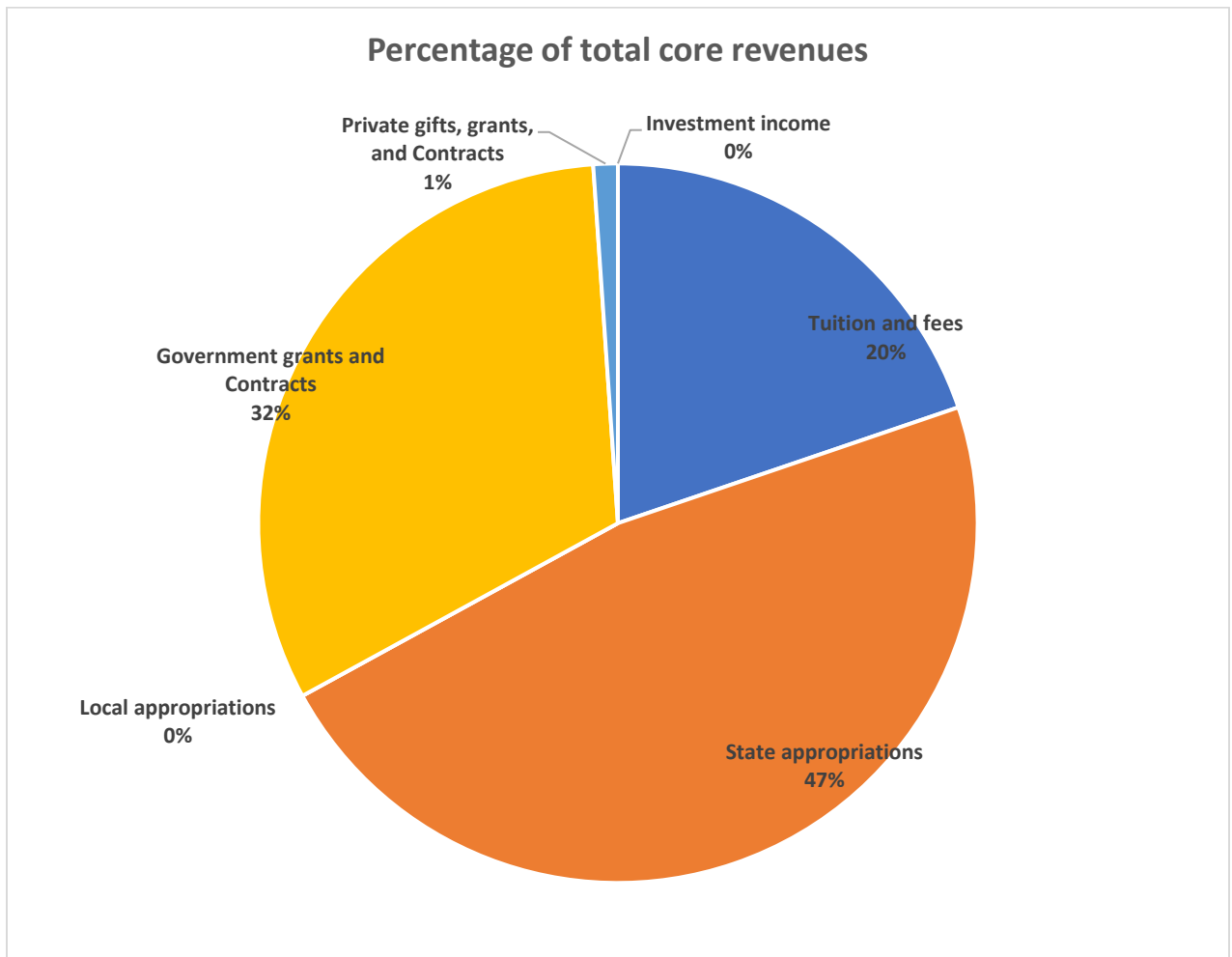
